



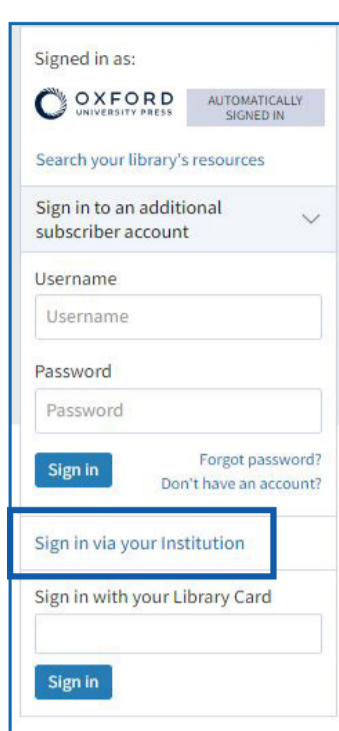

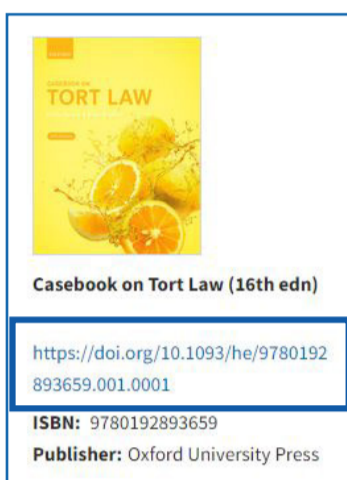
You and your students need to be logged in to your university network to gain access to Law Trove.

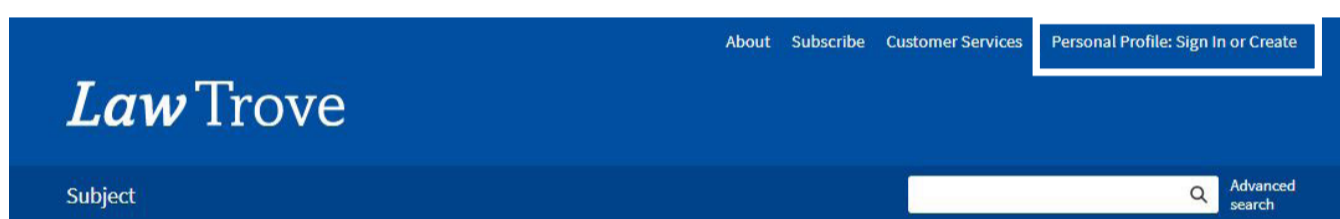

In order to get the most out of Law Trove, students will need to create a Personal Profile. This is done using the **'Create'** button in the top right-hand corner of the homepage.

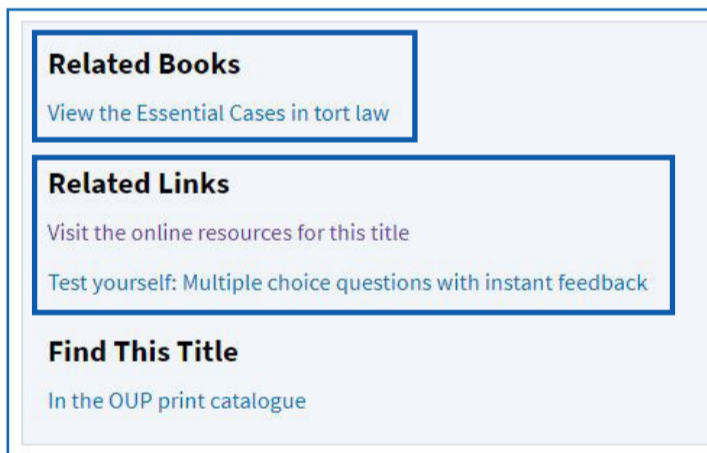
Setting up a Personal Profile allows users to highlight and annotate text, bookmark important passages, and save searches.

Revision resources

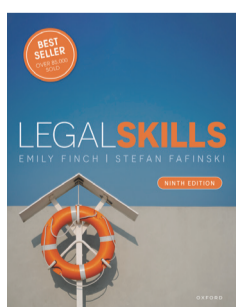
Law Trove includes access to all our Concentrate revision and study guides, and Concentrate Q&A guides.

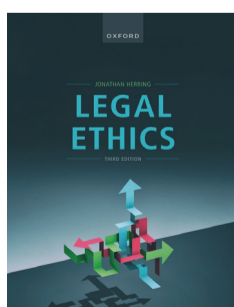
